Greetings GSR Readers!

Since the launch of Global Sisters Report in April 2014, we have grown our audience and now reach truly across the globe. We have readers in countries all over the world and are always looking to increase our readership.

Now we have a new tool we hope will attract even more readers. At the top right of your screen, you'll notice a "Translate This Page" button, made possible through Google Translate.

Readers can now translate the home page, individual story pages and archived stories and columns by pressing the "Translate This Page" button. We know that the automated translation option won't be perfect. But, based on emails we receive, we also know readers have used Google Translate on their own to read Global Sisters Report. This feature will make it even easier to do that.

We have chosen 10 languages — the six official languages of the United Nations: Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish; plus Portuguese, Italian, Swahili and Vietnamese. We chose the language options based on the United Nations languages and what we thought would be most appealing to readers based on our coverage and readership.
