'The Testament of Anne Lee'

Fantastic interview with Lewis Pullman (NCR, [Jan. 31, 2026](#))! I haven't had the opportunity to see "The Testament of Ann Lee" yet but it's been one of my most anticipated films for months now. I'm a big fan of director Mona Fastvold's past work,

most notably "The World to Come" (2020) and "The Brutalist" (2024), which she co-wrote.

Even before I noticed Fastvold's name as Testament's writer/director, I knew the film was a must see based on its powerhouse cast: Amanda Seyfried, Stacy Martin, Thomasin McKenzie, etc. And then there are Daniel Blumberg's songs, which entered my playlist immediately. All together it really gives me the sense that Testament is something wonderful.

I'm glad that "The Starling Girl" (Parmentier, 2023) was briefly discussed. Eliza Scanlen, criminally underutilized by Greta Gerwig in her 2019 "Little Women", is incredible in it.

While I have no intention of ever seeing "Thunderbolts" (Schreier, 2025), I have to admit that even his experience in that film must have been valuable to Pullman as an artist, since he was able to work with Florence Pugh, a generational talent.
